

## THE SIGNIFICANCE OF POYA (FULL MOON DAYS)

Before the birth of Buddhism, Asian ascetics - in the ancient times before there were calendars - made it a practice on full moon days to cease worldly pursuits and take time for reflection and religious activities. The Buddha adopted this practice and it continues today.

The Buddhist calendar is a lunar one and most festivals are celebrated on the full moon day. In the West this is often adjusted to a weekend date so more people are able to participate.

This is a day when individuals can take some time to be quiet and reflect.

A truly auspicious event will take place on Monday, October 17thwhen three candidates receive full ordination as a nun, or 'bhikkhuni', in the Theravada tradition. The ceremony will be held at Spirit Rock Meditation Centre in Woodacre, California, USA.
